Quick guide of setting up a Canvas Course Page

If you are new to Canvas, the easiest way to learn it is to work on a template. In this tutorial, I would like to show you how to import the Math 175 Canvas Page made by *Sarah Eichhorn* to create a template Canvas Course page for you.

A Canvas sandbox is basically a course shell that students do not have access to. You can use it to try out different features of Canvas.

10 Steps to create a template in Canvas.

Step 1: Download the file "Math 175.imscc" from

http://oort.math.uci.edu/~zhiqinlu/misc/





Step 3: Click "My Sandbox" (See screenshot below)




Step 4: Click "+Create Sandbox" (See screenshot below)




Step 5: Name your Sandbox and click "Create Sandbox" (See screenshot below)

You can have as many sandboxes as you like.




Step 6: After the sandbox is created, click "View in Canvas" (See screenshot below)




Step 7: You would see the screen like below. Click "Settings" on the lower left

Step 8: Click "Import Course Content" at the right (See screenshot below)



Step 9: Choose the setting similar to the below screenshot



Step 10: Once this is done, you can click "Modules" in the left, and see the following. This would be the template of your Canvas Course Page. Enjoy!




What is next?


After you modify the template, you can copy the contents to your canvas course webpage. What you need to do now are

- Goto https://grandcentral.eee.uci.edu/classes/Spring-2020 to request Canvas Couse Space. It takes up to 1 hour for the request to be approved, and one it is approved, you would receive an email.
- Once the course space is assigned, go to Canvas, cliick "courses" in the left. You should see the list of courses. Tip: Rename your courses in the "settings". For example, "Math 162A Lec A: Introduction to Diff. Geom (45190) should be

renamed "2019 Winter Math 162A", because course code "45190" is the same each year. (See below Screenshot for details)



3. Click "Settings" in the left, then click "Important Course Content" in the right.



4. Copy the course from the Sandbox as shown below. There is an option "Adjust events and due dates", but I have never used it before. (See below)
